Those efforts are not an easy task in these severe Corona times! First of all, the survival of the museum.

Like many other museums, Jean-Paul's was also badly hit by the corona crisis. There have been few visitors in the past six months. Schools and large groups have also failed to visit for same that reason.

With the help of the foundation and a crowdfunding campaign, the short-term financial worries have been averted, but if the situation does not change, the future of the museum is uncertain. The museum is currently closed. A visit and walk is only possible by appointment.

How does Jean-Paul, and we as a supporting foundation, try to keep the museum alive?
